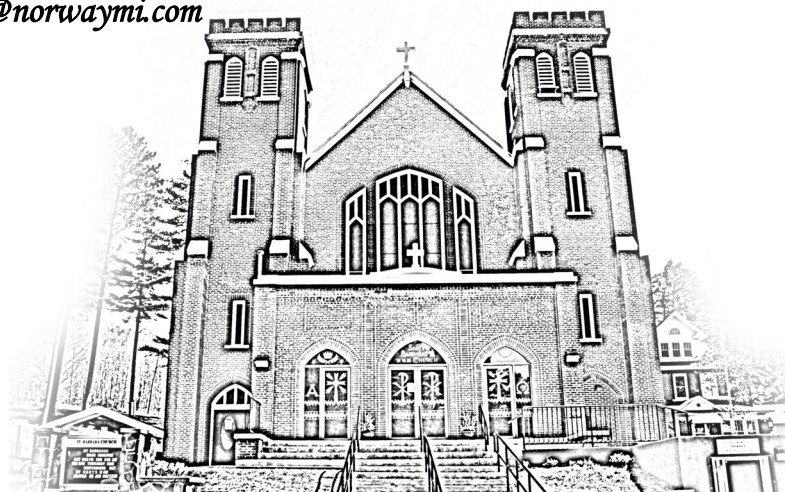

students this year is for them to be happy,
healthy, and learning.

Mr. Cole Wahoviak grew up in Merriman,
Michigan, before moving to Kingsford in high
school. Upon graduating from Kingsford High
School in 2013, he continued his education by
attending Michigan Technological University,
Bay De Noc Community College, Northern
Michigan University, and the University
of Phoenix. He completed his Bachelor's
degree in Political Science in 2019 and is
currently wrapping up a Master's degree in
Education. In his free time, he enjoys football,
basketball, hockey, golf, and spending time
with friends and family. Mr. Wahoviak's goals
for this year are to instill a love or respect for
history amongst his students and for them to
appreciate the necessity of proper writing.

Mr. Shawn Carlson is a scientist and has
spent most of his professional career as a
mineralogist working for various mining
companies engaged in searches for gem
diamond deposits throughout the United
States, Canada, and several countries in
Africa, Asia, and South America. He
taught as a professor at Northern Michigan
University in 2009. Mr. Carlson maintains
a small research laboratory in Iron County
and periodically offers analytical services for
mining and mineral exploration firms, and
is one of three co-authors on the Mineralogy
of Michigan book trilogy, the definitive texts
about our state's geographic mineralogy, an
attempt to list every important mineral known
from Michigan along with its precise localities.

This year he hopes to help write, assisted by
student input and contributions, two new
science education units. Mr. Carlson and his
students have begun science this year with
the topic of wild edibles foraging and will
transition from this into a Michigan-specific
unit on our rock and mineral resources.
Teaching from these topics will provide
students with a better hands-on
understanding and appreciation of our state
and local environment.

Mrs. Lynn Opolka has recently retired after
working 30 years at Norway-Vulcan Area
Schools. She is a life-long resident of Norway,
where she married and raised a son and a
daughter. Her children are both married
and living in Wisconsin. Mrs. Opolka enjoys
reading, going for walks, and spending time

rotating schedule.

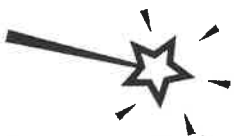
