





He taught as a professor at Northern Michigan University in 2009. Mr. Carlson maintains a small research laboratory in Iron County and periodically offers analytical services for mining and mineral exploration firms, and is one of three co-authors on the Mineralogy of Michigan book trilogy, the definitive texts about our state's geographic mineralogy, an attempt to list every important mineral known from Michigan along with its precise localities.

This year he hopes to help write, assisted by student input and contributions, two new science education units. Mr. Carlson and his students have begun science this year with the topic of wild edibles foraging and will transition from this into a Michigan-specific unit on our rock and mineral resources. Teaching from these topics will provide students with a better hands-on understanding and appreciation of our state and local environment.

Mrs. Lynn Opolka has recently retired after working 30 years at Norway-Vulcan Area Schools. She is a life-long resident of Norway, where she married and raised a son and a daughter. Her children are both married and living in Wisconsin. Mrs. Opolka enjoys reading, going for walks, and spending time with her three grandsons. 
